3 Mistakes to avoid

Mistake 1:

Postponing ISO 9001:2008 training, because the standard is changing

The need to provide your customers with great service is ongoing, and we strongly recommend you continue as planned with your quality management training. If you already have ISO 9001:2008 certification, the current standard will be recognized and can be audited to until the end of the 3 year transition period, expected to be September 2018. For any new customers, ISO 9001: 2008 certificates will not be issued after March 2017, therefore new certification after this date will be to ISO 9001:2015.





Mistake 2:

Thinking you don't need transition training because you already know ISO 9001

The two new transition courses will provide you with the tools and knowledge to help make a smooth transition to the new version of the standard. You will be able to learn about the new high level structure and the main differences between ISO 9001:2008 and ISO 9001:2015.

Mistake 3:

Delaying your transition training

The transition courses will be available for a limited time with limited places. The earlier you learn about the changes and how to make a smooth transition, the sooner you get it right for your organization and your customers. 83% of organizations believe staff are the key to maintaining a competitive edge,* so providing the right training to yours can be crucial in keeping one step ahead.
