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Better Regulation: A key priority for the Commission

- Independent scrutiny on the quality of EC analyses: Regulatory Scrutiny Board
- Review of EU acquis: Regulatory Fitness and Performance Programme (REFIT)
- Strengthened cooperation with Stakeholders and Member States



What is Better Regulation?

- Legislation/policy that delivers objectives at least cost and burden
- A common sense way of working throughout the policy cycle:
 - Evidence-based policy making that supports political decisions and delivers high quality initiatives;
 - Avoids unnecessary burdens for business/public authorities;
 - Ensures transparent participation of all stakeholders;
 - o Initatives deliver as foreseen and remain fit for purpose.
- <u>Not</u> deregulation but more efficient delivery of societal objectives.

The Commission IA system

Integrated approach

- All benefits and costs.
- Economic, social and environmental impacts.

Wide scope

 All initiatives with significant impacts, from policy defining proposals to implementing measures

Transparency

- Publication of Roadmaps, IAs and IAB opinions
- Comprehensive stakeholder consultation

Review by Regulatory Scrutiny Board



Regulatory Fitness and Performance Programme ("REFIT")

- Identify burdens, inconsistencies, gaps and ineffective measures across acquis ('Mapping')
- Assess: evaluations and Fitness Checks
- Consult: Involve Stakeholders
- Take action: withdraw, repeal, simplify, imp
- Track Progress: Scoreboard





Standardisation

- > A key tool to support better regulation
 - > Raise quality and safety
 - > Improve transparency
 - > Ensure interoperability
 - > Reduce costs and open up markets for businesses, especially SMEs
- An important alternative/complement to regulatory instruments



BR Guideliness and BR Toolbox

- Preference to use ENs adopted by the ESOs
- Preference to voluntary use of standards
- Preference to use indirect references to standards
 - Advantage of Flexibility: revision of hENs does not require corresponding adaptation of EU harmonisation legislation
 - > Advantage of Legal certainty: the EC maintains control of the final results through the publication of the hENs in the OJEU
 - Advantage of State of the Art: due to the use of hENs the EU harmonisation legislation corresponds to the 'State of the Art'
