Brexit

UK stakeholders support BSI to remain a full member of CEN and CENELEC

Over 30 organizations co-signed letter to Secretary of State

The endorsement from BEIS of the independence of BSI was crucial

CEN/CENELEC members voted for a derogation to 31 Dec 2020 to address the inconsistencies with a view to enabling the UK to continue as a full member

The UK Statutory instruments (no deal planning) effectively replicates the European model for the use of standards in delivery of regulatory policy

A new CEN/CENELEC working group has started work on the principles of membership and will propose changes to the statutes this year


