How does it work?

First, you will take a standard-specific course (e.g. ISO 9001 quality management) - training as either an internal auditor or lead implementer. On successful completion, qualifications can be earned in stages:

A mark of trust on your auditor's skills

As well as a certificate, your auditor will be entitled to use an exclusive mark of trust to give assurance to the business.

Prerequisites

Having a good understanding of the requirements of the standard is a pre-requisite to the programme. This can be achieved this by taking a one-day Requirements (or Introduction) course, or with a sufficient understanding of the standard, the exam can be taken standalone as a test of understanding.*

Examinations

There's a 90-minute, online exam at each stage to test understanding and prove expertise, except the certified stage where a post-course assessment will be submitted.

Becoming certified

At the final stage – certified auditor professional – a pack of post-course evidence will need to be validated by your organization to demonstrate that your auditor has successfully completed audits in the workplace.

What courses are part of the qualification pathway?

First, understand the requirements of the standard

This is a prerequisite of the qualified auditor programme. You can take a one-day course, usually called Requirements or Introduction, to give you a detailed understanding of the key terms, definitions and requirements of your chosen standard.

You'll confirm your understanding by successfully completing an online exam after the course. If you feel you already know the standard well enough, you may be able to opt to take the exam by itself.

Who's it for?: Those who need to understand a specific standard and anyone involved in the planning, implementing,

maintaining, supervising or auditing of a management system to that standard

Duration:* One or two days Assessment: Online exam

Step 1. Choose your route





Taking an internal auditor course means you'll develop the necessary skills to assess and report on the conformance and effectiveness of organizational processes in relation to the standard of your choice.

You'll learn how to initiate an audit, prepare and conduct audit activities, compile and distribute audit reports and complete follow-up activities.

Who's it for?:

Anyone involved in the auditing, maintaining or supervising of a management system

Duration:* Two days Assessment*: Online exam

Lead implementer

Taking a lead implementer course means you'll gain the knowledge of the requirements and methods for its implementation, and the skills to effectively lead, manage and delegate activities.

You'll learn what each clause requires for effective implementation and develp the soft and management skills to lead the implementation.

Who's it for?:

Anyone involved in the management and implementation of a management system

Duration:* Five days

Assessment*: Online exam

Lean Sigma or Six Sigma green belt and black belt

If you are a certified Lean Sigma or Six Sigma* Green Belt and Black Belt, there is an opportunity for you to shorten your qualification journey to achieve Certified Auditor Professional. You will be exempted step 3 and step 5a of the overall pathway.

Step 2. Lead auditor

You'll gain the knowledge and skills required to undertake and lead a successful audit. Using a step-by-step approach, you'll be guided through the entire audit process from initiation to follow-up.

You'll learn to describe the purpose of an audit and satisfy third party certification as well as grasp the key principles and practices of effective audits.

You'll acquire the skills to plan, conduct, report and follow-up an audit that establishes conformity, enhances compliance and improves overall organizational performance.

Who's it for?: Anyone with the need to audit a management system or who leads a team of auditors

Duration: Five days

Assessment: In some countries, a 2-hour exam during the final day of the course; in some an online exam

Next, focus your auditing skills on process improvement

These two courses will arm you with the knowledge and tools you need to look for opportunities for improvement, delivering real business benefits to your organization.

Step 3. Process improvement practitioner

This interactive and practical three-day course will provide first-hand experience of using a range of approaches and tools for effective process improvement. This will enable you to employ a process improvement framework that works effectively for your organization.

Who's it for?: Anyone who wants to apply an effective and structured process improvement framework and those

looking for practical, hands-on skills that can be applied in workplace

Duration: Three days

Assessment: Online exam

You'll earn a BSI badge **Certified Process Improvement Practitioner** for completing this course and its prerequisites, e.g.: BSI Certified ISO 27001 Process Improvemet Practitioner

Step 4. Process improvement auditor

This course is designed to provide you with knowledge and help develop your skills in auditing process improvement.

The course is built around a comprehensive case study which you will audit. This will enable you to apply process improvement auditing to an organization, covering reactive, incremental and stepped change improvements.

Who's it for?: Qualified lead auditors with experience of any management system discipline, especially those who'd

specifically like to develop their process improvement auditing knowledge and skills

Duration: Two days

Assessment: Online exam

You'll earn a BSI badge **Certified Process Improvement Auditor** for completing this course and its pre-requisites,, e.g.: BSI Certified ISO 45001 Process Improvement Auditor

Step 5a. Process improvement professional

This course is designed to provide you with knowledge and help develop your skills to manage the 'leadership' of a process improvement activity. The tools and techniques covered during the course are applicable to any process (or any management system process), so although the case study adopts a quality perspective, it can be understood from all disciplines.

Who's it for?: Qualified lead auditors with experience of any management system discipline, especially those who'd

specifically like to apply advanced, effective and structured process improvement methodologies

Duration: Two days

Assessment: Online exam

Step 5b. Go the extra mile

By submitting a post-course assessment pack validated by your manager or leadership team, you'll earn the right to use this mark on your professional profile for up to 3 years. From then you'll submit an update pack for review to ensure your skills are current and up-to-date.
